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**BRIDGING INSTITUTIONAL AND DIGITAL GOVERNANCE**


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Institutional accountability remains with leadership. Boards, audit committees, and senior management are responsible for the governance of their organisations — regardless of whether that governance is exercised through people/workers, processes, or digital systems.

Digital systems increasingly determine how organisations operate, how data is handled, and how institutional decisions are executed. Yet the governance structures surrounding those systems are often developed independently of — or after — the systems themselves. This creates a structural gap between institutional accountability and digital operational reality.

Michvi helps organisations to understand whether the governance structures surrounding their digital systems are adequate to meet the institutional responsibilities of their leadership. Michvi's assessments are structured to be directly relevant to governing boards, audit committees, procurement authorities, and senior management — not solely to technical teams. Michvi is registered in India and provides this advisory internationally, including to organisations across the United Kingdom, Europe, North America, Australia, Singapore, Middle East and to domestic organizations also .

**Digital Governance Assessment**

Structured review of an organisation's digital governance architecture. Michvi assesses how digital systems, platforms, and data flows are governed at the institutional level — examining governance structures, decision authorities, oversight mechanisms, and the currency and adequacy of governance documentation.

CAP-02

**Digital Signal Governance (DSG) Review**

Assessment of the signals generated, admitted, interpreted, and relied upon within an organisation's digital systems. Michvi examines whether signal generation and use are intentional, governed, and aligned with the organisation's stated governance and data practices. DSG Reviews address the governance gap between what an organisation's digital infrastructure does and what its leadership understands it to do.

**Design-Time Governance (DTG) Assessment**

Examination of governance decisions made during system design and configuration — before systems reach production. DTG Assessments review specifications, configuration records, approval documentation, and the governance processes applied at design time, addressing the governance gap created when systems are deployed without documented governance review.

CAP-04

**Executive Governance Review**

Senior advisory engagement providing governing boards, audit committees, and senior management with an independent governance perspective on the organisation's digital environment. Produces structured executive briefings and advisory packages enabling leadership to understand governance posture and demonstrate accountability to oversight bodies.

CAP-05

**Governance Visibility Assessment**

Assessment of whether leadership has adequate visibility into how the organisation's digital governance is performing. Michvi evaluates information flows, reporting structures, and oversight mechanisms — identifying gaps between the governance leadership believes is in place and the governance that is operationally active.

## GOVERNANCE ASSESSMENT SERVICES

All Michvi assessments are conducted through a structured, evidence-based assessment approach. Evidence is collected, findings developed and validated, recommendations produced, and assessments delivered in a manner that is consistent, auditable, and defensible.

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## RESEARCH AND FRAMEWORK DEVELOPMENT

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Michvi contributes to governance research through the development of conceptual frameworks for evaluating digital governance structures. These frameworks are non-operational, non-productive, and non-implementational in nature. They represent governance research contributions and are used as analytical reference points in assessment work.

### **Digital Signal Governance (DSG)**

A conceptual framework for evaluating whether the signals generated by an organisation's digital infrastructure are intentional, governed, and consistent with the organisation's stated governance and privacy practices. DSG provides a governance lens for assessing the alignment between digital operational behaviour and institutional accountability.

### **Design-Time Governance (DTG)**

A conceptual framework for evaluating governance decisions made at the time digital systems are designed, specified, and configured. DTG addresses the governance gap that arises when systems are deployed without documented governance review at the design stage.

### **Governance Visibility**

A conceptual framework for evaluating the adequacy of information flows and oversight mechanisms that allow institutional leadership to understand the governance state of their digital environment. Governance Visibility assessment identifies the gap between perceived governance and operationally active governance.
